	For courses in English, graduate students must provide proof of their
	English language proficiency (level B2 CEFR).
German Language Courses	Incoming exchange students can take German language courses free of
	charge if space is available. Pre-semester intensive language courses
	(usually A1-B1) start approx. two weeks prior to the start of the semester.

Program and Course Restrictions	All faculties of Universität Hamburg are open for exchange students. The

	final decision on acceptance is taken by the faculties. Closed for exchange students: dentistry, pharmacy. The Faculty of Medicine will accept applications only once per year. Please make sure to nominate students interested in studying at the Faculty of Medicine in the following academic year before the nomination deadline of 10 April. Students need to have completed at least three years of studies prior to exchange and provide proof of German language proficiency level B1 CEFR.
Semester Fees	All students of Universität Hamburg, including exchange students, pay a mandatory contribution fee per semester (winter semester 2018/19: EUR 275), which includes a public transport pass for the Hamburg Metropolitan Area.
Academic Calendar	Winter semester: 1 Oct31 March; summer semester: 1 April-30 Sept. For the lecture periods, see the website of Universität Hamburg.
Nomination Deadlines	Winter semester: 10 April (email to zentralaustausch@uni-hamburg.de, including statement of: name, field of study, study level, language level)  Summer semester: 10 October (email to zentralaustausch@uni-hamburg.de, including statement of: name, field of study, study level, language level)
Application Process	Application deadlines: Winter semester: 1 May; Summer semester: 1 November  Application documents (German or English) must be submitted by the partner university by E-Mail to zentralaustausch@uni-hamburg.de:  1. Statement of motivation 2. Tab. CV 3. Proof of German language proficiency (Level B1 CEFR) 4. Official transcripts 5. Two academic references 6. Preliminary course plan 7. Passport copy  Applications are reviewed by the faculties. In case of acceptance, the exchange coordinator sends an invitation letter to the student (winter semester: end of May; summer semester: end of November). The student gets access to the online manual "International Guide" guiding students through the registration process at Universität Hamburg and providing additional information on housing, course selection etc.
International Welcome Week	Early October each year.
Orientation Sessions	Most departments <u>offer orientation sessions</u> at the beginning of the winter semester, some at the beginning of the summer semester. The <u>International Welcome Week</u> for international students is held annually in early October.

Accommodation in Student Residence Halls	exchange students; rents vary (EUR 290-340). The housing application form
	provided by the exchange coordinator must be submitted by 15 June for the
	winter semester, by 15 December for the summer semester. If students
	have special needs concerning housing (disabilities etc.), please inform us
	well before the deadline!
Private Accommodation	Incoming exchange students are free to search for accommodation on their
	own. Rents vary according to size and location, but are usually much higher
	than in student residence halls. Please note that it is not easy to find
	private accommodation in Hamburg!

	health insurance (approx. 85 EUR/month for students). A list of all
